Klatovy – Pod Borem _

Industrial Zones in the Pilsen Region



The City of Klatovy (the second largest city in the Pilsen Region with more than 23,000 inhabitants) currently makes steps towards the development of a new industrial zone.

The industrial zone Pod Borem was selected as a priority site for new investments located in Klatovy three years ago. The valid master plan reserves this area explicitly for production activities. The change of owner, originally the Czech Army, has made the development of this locality possible. However, the city has initiated preparing of technical documentation and building-up of superior traffic infrastructure. At present the city owns majority of lands in the zone.

The construction of a new frontage road which will improve the I/27 road approach (in the direction of D5 motorway and Pilsen) is in progress. This road is about to be finished early in 2008. "We are very glad that we have managed to start this road construction which will provide a high-quality connection of the industrial zone to the public road system. The aim is to uprate the city road system that will make location of new investments possible and protect the city centre from heavy transportation", explains Rudolf Salvetr, Mayor of Klatovy.

The city wants to locate projects creating job opportunities for qualified employees in the zone. Klatovy can offer more than 20 hectares of lands for these purposes. Number and structure of job opportunities related to the planned investments are the main evaluative criteria for investors' selection. Companies have to take up their activities within 3 years after signing a contract. Fully utilised lands at a reasonable price will be a bonus for those who respect this condition.

Barracks Stříbro

Brownfields in the Pilsen Region



The main effort of the city is to integrate the former barracks Stříbro into the city structure and improve the image of this locality.

Stříbro gained the deserted military area in April 2007. The territory exceeds 45 hectares and represents a significant development site suited for the expansion and localization of activities for which the city could not find any appropriate place. Because of the fact that Stříbro belongs to regions with higher number of job opportunities, projects concern especially housing construction, civic amenities and futhermore location of production investments. It is an opportunity for new investors or companies already occurring in the city and its surrounding. Being situated about 8 km from D5 motorway Stříbro is an attractive destination on the way between Pilsen and German border.

The preliminary study for revitalization and development of the former barracks has been worked up under the support of the Regional Authority of the Pilsen Region and the state agency Czechlnvest. It was within the frame of the project "Mapping of brownfields in the Pilsen Region". The document, the Regional Development Agency of the Pilsen Region has co-operated on, analyses not only existing infrastructure and buildings but also external influences and surroundings of this brownfield. Part of the study has been focused on proposal of the new area layout supplemented by functions acceptable for various parts of this territory and final recommendation for the locality including the cost estimation. The study results are instrumental towards the decision making within this area and information of citizens about the revitalization process.

The municipality's aim is to put across the proposal from the above mentioned study which respects the valid master plan and other details. "We have established a special workgroup for this project. The members of municipal council have agreed that it is not convenient to sell out the area in parts. We would prefer to find a strategic partner or a developer who will be able to invest private financial resources and cooperate with the municipality on a long term basis. Of course we take account of possibility to apply for grants from the EU Structural Funds", says Miroslav Nenutil, Mayor of Stříbro.

New Course "Civil Engineering" Human Resources and Economics at the UWB in Pilsen



Starting with the academic year 2007/2008 Faculty of Applied Sciences (University of West Bohemia in Pilsen) is about to open a new course "Civil Engineering" within the frame of the field of study Mechanics. It is conceived as a three-year bachelor study programme with a possibility of continuing to the master study programme. The aim is to prepare adepts in civil engineering with knowledge of informatics, management and construction legislation. Graduates can find a job in the sphere of public administration and municipal government, setup of investments and general civil engineering.

The University of West Bohemia in Pilsen (UWB) with its seven faculties is the only institution of higher education in this part of the country which prepares students (more than 17,200) for careers in electrical and mechanical engineering, economics, education, humanities, fine arts, law and public administration. The UWB was established in 1991 when the Institute of Technology in Pilsen (Mechanical Engineering and Electrical Engineering) and the College of Education were merged. The University of West Bohemia in Pilsen is involved in the international exchange of students and international projects with universities in Europe, the USA and many other countries.

New R&D company located in BIC Plzen premises

Another multinational company that located its R&D activities in Pilsen is TETRACO INTERNATIONAL holding. After software labs of Panasonic, R&D center of Mercedes-Benz and others. Tetraco follows the positive trend of localization of business activities which are not based on low costs of labor force in the Pilsen region but mainly on high qualification and technical skills of personnel.

Tetraco International s.r.o. established a new electronic laboratory in the Technology center BIC Plzen in summer 2006 (at that time under the trade name Seidel und Naumann s.r.o.) and began executing their development services in the field of electronics and software focusing on video systems and industrial application. Company has hired 6 employees for these activites so far, mainly the University of West Bohemia (UWB) graduates. They are using more than 100 sq. m. of premises in newly reconstructed building in the Pilsen Municipal Industrial Park Borska Pole.

Dutch holding of Tetraco International operates in several European countries such as Germany, Netherlands and Romania. Their Czech headquarters is located in Liberec. The company is closely cooperating with many local universities, it is mainly the Technical University of Liberec in the Czech Republic. Cooperation with the Faculty of Electrical Engineering (UWB) is planned.

The company management has made sure that the locality of the Pilsen Municipal Industrial Park Borska pole provides optimal conditions for further development and they are going to extend their activities there. Within the context of this fact the firm wants to hire other employees, especially development engineers. Tetraco International s.r.o. also plans investments in another science and technology equipment such as EMC rooms for measuring of the electromagnetic compatibility, located in the building of the new Science and Technology Park Plzen.
